

**NEVADA STATE BOARD OF
PHYSICAL THERAPY EXAMINERS**

MINUTES FOR BOARD MEETING SEPTEMBER 27, 2012

Item 1- Call to order / roll call to determine the presence of a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 9:07am by Chairman Sidener. Board members present: Kathleen Sidener, PT, Chairman; Lisa Mukavitz, PT, Vice Chairman; Louie Puentedura, PT, Secretary/Treasurer; Andrea Menicucci, PT, Public Member; Tina Baum, PT. Non-members in attendance: Richard Dreitzer, legal counsel; Allison Tresca, executive director; Jackie Miklas, inspector.

Item 2 - Pledge of Allegiance.

Item 3 – Public comment period. There was no public comment.

Item 4- Applicant Ralph Clemmons appears to request licensure. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's fingerprinting report and two failed attempts at the Nevada jurisprudence examination.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.

Second: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion, after passing the NPTE and the jurisprudence examination, offer one year probation, with primary and secondary supervisors, re-print for fingerprinting background, and must appear before to request release: Puentedura.

Second: Mukavitz.

Item 5- Applicant Timothy P. Dwyer requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's absence from the field.

Motion to closed session: Mukavitz.

Second: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to offer 2-year probationary license, with primary and secondary supervisors, require 3.0 units of approved education, in addition to the annual licensure renewal requirement; offer valid for 6 months from date of meeting; must appear to request release: Puentedura.

Second: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

Board member Baum recommends that the applicant complete the units in the area of his practice.

- Item 6- Applicant Tina Marie Thornton requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination a fourth time in accordance with NRS 640.140.

Motion to enter closed session: Mukavitz.

Second: Menicucci.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to grant request: Mukavitz.

Second: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

The applicant advised the Board that the format of the test is being changed, and suggested a review of the FSBPT website for the specifics. She noted that there are fewer questions pertaining to research and teaching, and more questions on orthopedics and neuro.

- Item 7- Applicant Marie Eugenie M. Pabustan requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination a fifth time in accordance with NRS 640.140.

Motion to enter closed session: Mukavitz,

Second: Menicucci.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to grant request; must register by December 22 for the January 29, 2013 test date: Mukavitz,

Second: Menicucci.

Passes unanimously.

Board member Baum advised the applicant to visit the FSBPT website to review the content changes.

- Item 8- Applicant Steven Bolick appears to request licensure. The appearance is necessary to address the applicant's fingerprinting report.

Motion to enter closed session: Mukavitz

Second: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion, after passing the NPTE, offer one year probation, with primary and secondary supervisors, re-print for fingerprinting background, and must appear before to request release: Mukavitz.

Second: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

Item 9- Continuation of August 21, 2012 meeting: Case #2011-08 - Brian Werner:

Item taken by court reporter. Please contact Board for transcript of open session.

License was suspended for 60 days, followed by two years probation.

Item 10- Complaint Hearings or Review and Approval of Consent Decrees.

Case #2010-24 – Gary C. Amick.

Motion to enter closed session: Mukavitz.

Second to motion: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to continue until January 2013 meeting at which time it must be settled, or heard at that time: Sidener.

Second: Andrea.

Passes, with Board member Puentedura abstained as he is the investigative board member.

Case #2011-15 – Brian Fearnley.

Board member Mukavitz recused herself as she has personal knowledge of the licensee. Board member Puentedura recused himself as the investigating board member. Richard Dreitzer stated that the complaint pertains to medical records that are unclear, and it was not an intentional omission, simply sloppy charting by the licensee. Mr. Dreitzer stated that the licensee has executed a consent decree.

Motion to accept: Baum.

Second: Sidener.

Passes with Baum, Sidener, Menicucci. Abstaining: Mukavitz and Puentedura.

Item 11- Review and discussion of the Bill Draft Language of The Nevada State Board of Occupational Therapy. A representative of the Occupational Therapy Board will be in attendance.

David Tanabe, OTR/L, Vice Chairman, and Loretta Ponton, Executive Director appeared. Ms. Ponton advised the Board that the changes are mostly administrative in nature, and give the Board the ability to be more effective. Many of the changes were suggested from the National Association. She indicated that no updates to the language had been made in many years, and they needed to address how the practice has evolved. Board member Mukavitz asked why the term “patients” was changed to “clients. Ms. Ponton stated that the original language pertained to a medical setting and the term “patient” seems to imply a medical setting. They are suggesting the term client be used as there are OTs in schools. David Tanabe indicated that “patient” to them means a referral, but “client” includes all persons who receive services. Board member Baum asked if they have direct access. Mr. Tanabe said yes. Board member Puentedura noted that reimbursement is always an issue when there is no referral. Board member Puentedura asked what differentiates PT from OT in outpatient setting, and noted that a physical therapist’s concern is that the hand moves to the elbow, which moves to the shoulder, which moves to spine, and so on. He stated that the patient has to be treated by whoever will serve the needs of the patient. Board member Sidener stated that the previous language limited care to the upper extremities, and the new language is not limiting. Mr. Tanabe stated he cannot speak for what the schools are training, but it was noted that the national test does not include lower extremities. Board member Sidener stated that if the schools are not teaching lower extremities and the national test does not contain such questions, then the language in the practice act should be for only upper extremities. Jackie Miklas, board inspector, stated they she gets questions in home health regarding supervision of COTAs, noting that they do not have a supervision requirement in OT, and that there are a lot of unsupervised COTAs out there, especially in home health. Ms. Ponton stated that their Board has heard the same thing and the Board will revisit the supervision requirement, and she noted that the COTAs have to document supervision for 1 hour of every 40 hours of work, and the OT signs off on that supervision. Ms. Ponton stated that the Board conducts random audits of the required logged time. Board member Sidener asked what the definition “other settings” was. Mr. Tanabe stated it was aquatic and hippo therapy, not athletics. Ms. Ponton indicated that the language is directly from the national association. Ms. Miklas asked if dry needling was within their scope of practice. Ms. Ponton said it was not.

Motion for the director to write a letter to the OT Board, stating that this Board reviewed and discussed the OT Board’s BDR and no objections at this point, and request updates on any changes: Puentedura.

Second: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

Item 12- Update of legislative activities from Paula Berkley. Ms. Berkley advised the Board that last session there were 20-25 bills pertaining to boards, but that there are much fewer this year. She indicated that the Sunset Review

Committee was reviewing the Boards and revising the process along the way. She noted there were a lot of new people this session due to term limits. She noted that there is a bill designed by Frankie Sue DelPapa regarding illegal practice of medicine, which is prevalent in the Hispanic community. She noted that two Boards had been abolished as they had not met in 5 years. Board member Puentedura thanked Ms. Berkley for her efforts on behalf of the Board.

Item 13- Request from Board staff regarding the option to allow examination candidates to view their pass/fail status via the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy website. The director stated she is not in favor of this, as the applicants always have questions, whether they pass or fail, and calling them allows for that to be communicated to them at the time they learn of their score. She stated that it was helpful to remind the applicant that they cannot practice until they have license, give them a timeframe for the issuance of the license, ask regarding practice location, etc. Janelle Lauchman with the NPTA stated that the licensee supervising a graduate knows the license must be issued to the new graduate in order for them to work without supervision, so it is a moot point to remind them because they all know that. Board member Mukavitz stated that an applicant waiting for test results wants that information right away. Board member Baum stated that people are technologically savvy and expect to get information as soon as possible.

Motion to allow candidates to view their pass/fail status via the FSBPT website:
Mukavitz.

Second: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

Item 14- Request from the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy to post a link on the Board's website or add an item in the Board's next newsletter regarding their aPTitude program. Board member Baum stated that she learned of the program at the annual FSBPT meeting, and the Board's can control what information is listed. The director stated that the Board has to sign up to control the date and report to them any changes, etc. or it will not work. Motion to deny the request to post on website, but will place information in the next newsletter as to the program, with notice that the program does not relieve the licensee from renewing, reporting their units to the Board at renewal time, or maintaining their certificates of completion: Puentedura.

Second: Mukavitz.

Passes unanimously.

Item 15- Request from Board staff regarding the process of obtaining the required professional references for new applicants. The director noted that Board staff spends a great deal of time contacting references, receiving changes of references from applicants, re-faxing and mailing letters, etc. and it is very time consuming. The director suggested requiring the applicants to secure the letters and submit them with their application.

Motion to change the application process to require the references to accompany the application: Mukavitz.

Second: Menicucci.

Passes unanimously. The director was advised to list the change in the next newsletter.

- Item 16- Request from Board member Puentedura to review and reconsider the Adopted Guidelines for Board Members. Board member Puentedura stated that the Board should follow policy, and that was not done with last motion for Board positions. Chairman Sidener stated all policies should be reviewed at once for any considerations. Board member Mukavitz stated that the members are agreeable to whatever needs to be done to follow the Board's mission. Inspector Miklas stated that it was time for law changes, and indicated that based on previous minutes, a review is done about 6 months prior. The director stated that the Board has determined several months back to not propose any law changes for the legislative session, and that NAC changes are set for January 2013 to review, and that will be followed by the required workshops and public hearings. The NPTA stated that they want the Board's policy manual posted on the Board's website.

Motion to review policies at the next meeting and consider the NPTA's request to post the policies on the Board's website: Puentedura.

Second: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

- Item 17- Review and approval of per diem policy. Inspector Miklas stated she had some questions regarding reimbursements, noting that Board members are reimbursed for mileage, but staff is not. She asked where inspectors fall within these two categories. She stated that when she was hired, Pete Mooney advised her that mileage to and from the Board office would be reimbursed. She stated that the office is not centrally located for most licensees, and any staff or Board member should be reimbursed for mileage. Board member Menicucci stated that employees are not paid to commute, and noted that the IRS rules allow so many miles per day for deduction. Mr. Dreitzer noted that Board members are not staff. Inspector Miklas stated that she thinks it is a good idea for the inspectors to attend the Board meetings, and reimbursing for mileage encourages attendance. She stated that as she read the policy, she felt something was not consistent. Board member Puentedura asked Ms. Miklas if she would be discouraged from attending the meetings because of this issue. Ms. Miklas said she would attend, whether or not she was reimbursed for mileage, but stated that inspectors should be reimbursed for mileage to and from the board office, and that the office should be equidistant to most people. Board member Puentedura stated that perhaps they could distinguish between staff that comes to the office daily, vs. staff that does not. Board member Mukavitz stated that the Board can review the wording of the policy, but the Board has to be consistent with state law, and reduce expenses. Ms. Miklas stated that someone who lives in Boulder City may apply to the Board and if

they learn they will not get reimbursed to go to the office, they may not apply, which may limit the amount of applicants. Board member Mukavitz noted that the mileage can be deducted per IRS regulations. Ms. Miklas noted that she wanted clarification and that it was not an issue for her, but where inspectors fall in this policy. Ms. Miklas asked about the 75% reimbursement rate when traveling over 8 hours. The director noted that the state administrative manual sets forth the policies pertaining to travel and the language is directly from that manual. The director will forward a copy of the state administrative manual to Ms. Miklas.

Motion to accept the policy: Mukavitz.
Second: Puentedura.
Passes unanimously.

Item 18- Discussion and determination of parameters for annual routine inspections. The director advised the Board that the typical percentage is 30%, and excludes rural areas, home health agencies and education institutions. She noted that the facilities reviewed the previous year are usually excluded from the 30%. It was also discussed that rural Nevada is inspected every three years. She also noted that the last routine inspections were conducted late due to the retirement of Mr. Mooney, and the amount inspected was 15%. Ms. Miklas noted that she has cases to complete and will need time for the inspections, too. Ms. Miklas stated that she was told inspections needed to be completed by May 22. The director noted that inspections begin after renewal period each year, usually in September or October. Inspector Miklas stated that home health may be difficult to inspect, but she believes there is a lot of abuse there. She asked if Alex Delgado, board inspector, would be assisting in the inspections. The director stated that Mr. Delgado is very busy, and has students scheduled.

Motion to inspect 30% of facilities, excluding rural Nevada, school districts, and physical therapy/physical therapy assistant educational institutions, include home health: Baum.
Second: Mukavitz.
Passes unanimously.

Item 19- Request from Jackie Miklas, board inspector, to review the policy on assigning cases to the board members. Ms. Miklas indicated she did not see the policy when she was hired and wanted to know how cases are assigned. She indicated that Mr. Mooney had told her that cases are assigned to Board members on the opposite side of the state of the location of the therapist. Board member Mukavitz said that staff does try to do that, but not always possible. Board member Puentedura stated that the members know a lot of licensees in the north and south and that the physical therapy community in Nevada is small. Ms. Miklas asked what the procedure was to bring in Board members when a quorum cannot be established. The director advised that the Governor's office would be contacted and Board members appointed for an item in which a

quorum could not be established. Ms. Miklas stated that the cases need to be distributed more equitably. Mr. Dreitzer stated that the director makes every attempt to assign cases to be fair and equitable. Ms. Miklas indicated that three cases were assigned to Board member Puentedura and it was her understanding that a faculty member would not be given a case if the licensee had been taught at that school. The director noted that Board members are not assigned cases if they have worked with the applicant within the past three years and the same time-frame applies to educators. Ms. Miklas asked if three years was enough time. Board member Baum indicated that the Board member has the responsibility to make the call to recuse or take a case and none of the members wants to jeopardize a case. Ms. Miklas asked what the process was if the Board member was biased. Mr. Dreitzer stated that the members take their ethical responsibilities seriously. Ms. Miklas stated that she wants clarification if it appears to her a member was biased and had an association with the licensee subject to the investigation. Chairman Sidener stated that it may be Ms. Miklas' perception, but the IBM has their perception and they know the responsibility to be fair. Board member Puentedura said he wanted to know what the procedure would be in such a case and the director stated that the decision rests with the IBM, but if there is a concern, the investigator can contact the IBM or legal counsel. Mr. Dreitzer indicated that the final decision is with the IBM, and he believes that the Board members make the decisions with much thought.
