

**NEVADA STATE BOARD OF
PHYSICAL THERAPY EXAMINERS
BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF
JULY 12, 2013**

Item 1- Call to order / roll call to determine the presence of a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 8:37am by Chairman Sidener. Board members present: Kathy Sidener, PT, Certified MDT, Chairman; Louie Puentedura, PT, DPT, PhD, FAAOMPT, Vice Chairman; Tina Baum, PT, ATC, CLT, Secretary/Treasurer; Jim McKivigan, DC, PT, MPA, MA; Andrea Menicucci, MS, CCC-SLP, Public Member. Non-members in attendance: Allison Tresca, executive director; Richard Dreitzer legal counsel.

Item 2 – Pledge of Allegiance.

Item 3 – Public comment period. Chairman Sidener welcomed the physical therapy students from UNLV. The attendees were encouraged to follow the items on the agenda and ask questions. A student asked if there was a set maximum on NPTE attempts. Chairman Sidener stated there was not at the present time, but the Board must approve all third and subsequent attempts.

Item 4- Applicant Marie Eugenie M. Pabustan requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary to address the applicant's work experiences and absence from the field.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.

Second to motion: Menicucci.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion by Puentedura to grant probation upon receipt of Board approved primary and secondary supervisors; term of 1½ years, must work full time; must complete 3.0 units of Board approved continuing education in addition to the annual renewal requirement, 1.5 of which must be via an on-site course; must appear to request release.

Second to motion: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

Item 5- Applicant Gerardo Celis requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination for Physical Therapist's Assistants a fourth time in accordance with NRS 640.140.

Motion to enter closed session: Baum.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion by Baum to take October 9, 2013 test.
Second to motion: Sidener.
Passes unanimously.

- Item 6- Applicant Jennifer L. Tiutiunnyk requests to take the National Physical Therapy Examination for Physical Therapist's Assistants a fourth time in accordance with NRS 640.140.

Motion to enter closed session: Menicucci.
Second to motion: McKivigan.
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to allow applicant to test in October, and the Board recommends but does not mandate the applicant take Anatomy & Physiology: Sidener.
Second to motion: Baum.
Passes unanimously.

- Item 7- Applicant Sharon Louthan requests to be licensed. This appearance is necessary due to the previous appearance before the Board based on the applicant's license activity in two other jurisdictions.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.
Second to motion: Menicucci.
Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to direct the applicant to contact the Arizona Physical Therapy Board to secure information as to the fact that they held a hearing, knowing the applicant was not able to appear due to her husband's medical situation: Puentedura.
Second: Menicucci.
Passes unanimously.

- Item 8- Licensee Anna Marie G. Stack Rivas requests to be released from probation.

Motion to enter closed session: Puentedura.
Second to motion: McKivigan.
Passes unanimously.

After returning open session:

Motion to release from probation, having met all of the requirements: Baum.
Second to motion. Menicucci.
Passes unanimously.

Item 9- Licensee Mindy O. Renfro requests to be released from probation, which is not yet completed, and requests to not renew her license.
The meeting was closed by order of Chairman, with agreement from the applicant who was appearing telephonically.

After returning to open session:

Board member McKivigan recused himself as he worked with the licensee previously. Motion to allow the licensee to not renew her license, noting in her record that her license status would be listed as “Expired while on Probation”, and the licensee’s file would be noted that she completed the probationary requirements for the initial period of probation, part of which was completed while the licensee lived out of state; and if the licensee reinstates within 2 years, she would be required to complete the remainder of her probationary requirements; and after two years if the licensee seeks licensure, she would be required to appear before the Board: Sidener.

Item 10- Licensee Jennifer Ford requests for early release from probation.

Motion to enter closed session: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

After returning to open session:

Motion to deny request for early release, as the licensee has not worked enough hours under probation to warrant release: Puentedura.

Second to motion: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

Item 11- Complaint Hearings or Review and Approval of Consent Decrees.

Case #2012-05 / Victoria Lee. The item was tabled to allow the licensee the opportunity to consider the Consent Decree.

Case #2012-27 / Bernard Lubin. Richard Dreitzer summarized the Consent Decree, noting the violation was failure to timely notify the Board of a change in address, resulting in a fine of \$50, costs of \$325.

Board member Puentedura recused himself on this item as he is the investigating Board member.

Motion to approve: Menicucci.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

Case #2012-40 / David Allan Gossard. Richard Dreitzer summarized the Consent Decree, noting there were several violations for failure to notify the Board of changes in address, resulting in a fine of \$150, costs of \$450.

Board member Menicucci recused herself on this item as she is the investigating Board member.

Motion to approve: Puentedura.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

Case #2012-42-H / Timothy D. Hudson. This item was tabled to allow the licensee the opportunity to consider the Consent Decree.

Case #2012-42O- / Jill Eudora Ormon. This item was tabled to allow the licensee the opportunity to consider the Consent Decree.

Item 12- Review and approval of minutes for Board meeting of May 9, 2013.

Motion to approve the minutes with grammatical changes: Puentedura.

Passes unanimously.

Passes unanimously.

Item 15- Review and approval of executive session minutes for Board meeting of May 30, 2013.

Motion to approve as written: Puentedura.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

Item 16- Review and approval of Treasurer's Report for period ending April 2013. The director advised the Board that the accountant made the journal entries from the audit and the bookkeeper had been hired. The bookkeeper will look at the books

each month and make sure all entries are coded correctly and make any adjustments needed.

Second to motion: Puentedura.
Passes unanimously.

Item 17- Review and approval of Profit and Loss Report for period ending April 2013.

Passes unanimously.

Second to motion: Sidener.
Passes unanimously.

Item 19- Review and approval of Treasurer's Report for period ending May 2013.

Motion to approve: Baum.
Second to motion: Sidener.
Passes unanimously.

Item 20- Review and approval of Profit and Loss Report for period ending May 2013. Louie, McKivigan

Item 21- Review and approval of Balance Sheet as of May 2013.

Motion to approve: Sidener.
Second to motion: Puentedura.
Passes unanimously.

Item 22- Review and approval of current Fiscal Year Budget Report. The interest income was questioned as it was high. The director noted the amount was due to CDs maturing, but she would verify that during break. The item was not re-visited due to time constraints.

Item 23- Review and approval of Executive Director's Report as of June 30, 2013.

Motion to approve: Menicucci.
Second to motion: McKivigan.
Passes unanimously.

Item 24- Review and discussion of Board of Occupational Therapy policy regarding interdisciplinary practice. It was discussed that Richard Dreitzer attended a meeting of the Occupational Therapy Board to discuss this issue and he is pleased they have put their position on this into their policies. It was noted that those who

are dually licensed as PT and OT, have unique situations as they wear different hats throughout each day. Chairman Sidener advised the director to contact the OT Board to thank them for their work on the policy. It was noted that the opinion did not mention the use of technicians, unlicensed persons. Board member Menicucci noted that the PT law is very specific to supervision. Board member Baum stated she is concerned with billing, as there can be overlap in practice. Board member Sidener stated that the billing must be accurate, and a direct representation of what occurred with the patient. Board member Puentedura noted that the policy is fine, but reminded the Board that the OT Board enforces their laws, the PT Board enforces the PT law. He stated that the PT Board should have a similar policy, and Richard Dreitzer agreed to draft it. Board member Menicucci stated she hopes the OT Board will add specific language to their law regarding the use of technicians.

Motion to draft policy regarding dual licensure of PT/OT: Puentedura.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

Item 25- Appointment of Board members to attend the annual meeting of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy October 10 to October 12, 2013.

Motion to approve any member who wants to attend, including legal counsel: Sidener.

Second to motion: McKivigan.

Passes unanimously.

Item 26- Board member James McKivigan reports on his attendance at the Board member training held through the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy. Board member McKivigan reported that the FSBPT has a lot of resources, and noted the Boards are not alone in their mission. He stated there were representatives from different states, and he learned what different jurisdictions were doing. He noted that POPTS was very high on the list of topics for many of the jurisdictions.

Item 27- Appointments to the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education. The item will be held until the November meeting, as Jenelle Lauchman expressed interest and will submit her resume and letter of interest.

Item 28- At the request of Board member Puentedura, review and discussion pertaining to the denial of courses and if denial means the course is not within the scope of practice. Board member Puentedura stated that one argument that has been discussed is if the Board denies a course, then it is considered outside of scope of practice. He cited an example, stating that if the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education denies a course as too basic, would that mean it was outside of scope. The director noted that when courses are denied, the committee must cite a reason, whether too basic, instructor not qualified, outside of scope, etc. She noted that only those deemed outside of scope, are actually outside of scope, not those denied for other reasons. Richard Dreitzer stated that a course can be within the scope of practice, but denied for another reason.

Item 29- Review and approval of Board policies. Board member Puentedura noted that it looks like there are two documents in one; an employee manual and policies. The director noted that the employee manual is basically a copy of what all Nevada agencies have, and pertains to dress code, security, required breaks, state holidays, etc. The policy manual has to do with office procedures for processing, and other matters. Board member Puentedura stated the documents should remain separate. It was noted that the policies amount to about 15-20 pages. Jenelle Lauchman, NPTA President, stated that it is disheartening to learn the manual has so few pages, and noted that her work manual is 50-60 pages. The director noted that the employee manual is very extensive and its contents apply to all agencies. She also noted that there are numerous statues the Board is required to follow for things such as notices of appearance, open meeting law, administrative law. Board member Sidener noted there were some changes to make: Public Member cannot serve as Vice Chairman; add the Licensee Bill of Rights; Executive Director to notify Chairman of vacation time. It was noted that the director already notifies the Chairman of time-off, but it is not in the manual. Chairman Sidener tabled the item until the September meeting.

Item 30- Review the letter of resignation of Angelo Sakelaris, Board Inspector. Letter from Mr. Sakelaris was read into the record. Chairman Sidener noted that Mr. Sakelaris worked for the Board for 13 years and did an excellent job. She noted that the licensees appreciated his hard work, and his demeanor when performing inspections. The director noted that a plaque had been ordered, and the Chairman indicated she would invite Mr. Sakelaris to the September meeting to thank him.

Item 31- Review and consideration of applications for the Inspector position.

The Chairman read a brief background of the applicants, Deborah Dieter, Kyle Hamilton, Stacy Luisa Carman and Carrie Gillis. Board member Puentedura stated he can speak highly of applicant Gillis. Board member Menicucci stated that applicant Dieter is extremely knowledgeable high skilled and she knows a lot of people throughout all areas of therapy. It was noted that applicant Carman does not meet the criteria as she has not worked in Nevada for at least five years. It was discussed that the applicants should be invited to attend one of the next two meetings to meet the Board face to face. It would not be a formal interview, just an opportunity to meet. It was noted that the position was advertised in the May Newsletter, so all licensees have been notified of the position.

Item 32- Update of activities of Board office.

The director noted that renewals were going well. She advised the Board that there was a problem with the renewal update and address change links, which required a programmer to correct. She also reported that the state changed the deposit link for renewal income, and it was being deposited into the general fund. She noted

that she investigated all transfers and deposits and has ensured that all Board funds have been collected and deposited accordingly. The director noted that the office lease was set to expire in February 2014 and the state was again handling all leases. She noted that the legislative session created a lot of new regulations and she would ensure the Board would take all necessary action.

Item 33- Review of files/ratification for licensure.

Motion to ratify: Puentedura.

Second to motion: Baum.

Passes unanimously.

Item 34- Consideration of courses recommended by the Advisory Committee on Continuing Education at their meeting of May 20, 2013 for the units listed through July 31, 2014.

Board member Puentedura stated that he was disappointed the Cranio Sacral therapy course was approved and cited it was extemporaneous practice. Jenelle Lauchman said she believed the language in the white paper would indicate denial because it is an issue that has scientific information to invalidate. It was noted the Committee approved the course unanimously.

The APTA Workshop for Faculty was denied, and the Board questioned that denial. The Advisory Committee for Continuing Education Chairman Joe Cracraft stated that the course description warranted denial. He noted the timeline described writing test questions, how to write good multiple choice questions and preparing students to take examinations. That description does not help the clinical practice of licensees. Suzanne Brown submitted a letter seeking the Board approval of the course, and listed the course content in her letter. It was noted that the content provided by Ms. Brown did not match what was submitted by the APTA. Board member Puentedura asked who this would affect, as a very limited number of licensees take the course. The director noted that if the licensee relies on this course for their required continuing education, it will matter.

Motion to contact the APTA for a revised/updated course description and timeline: Puentedura.

Second: Sidener.

Passes unanimously.

Motion to approve and deny the courses as listed: Baum.

Second: Sidener.

Passes with Puentedura in opposition of the approval of the Cranio Sacral courses.
