BOARD MEETING MINUTES JANUARY 29, 2015

Item 1- Call to order / roll call to determine the presence of a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 9:35 by Chairman Puentedura. Board members present: Louie Puentedura, PT, DPT, PhD, FAAOMPT, Chairman; Tina Baum, PT, ATC, CLT, Vice Chairman; Jim McKivigan, DC, PT, MPA, MA, Secretary-Treasurer; Sherise R. Smith, PT, MS, CBIS; Andrea Menicucci, MS, CCC-SLP, Public Member. Non-members in attendance: Richard Dreitzer, legal counsel; Allison Tresca, executive director; Richard Ruoti, PT, Inspector.

Item 3- Public comment period. There was no public comment.

- Item 14- The Board's lobbyist, Paula Berkley, set to appear to update the Board on her activities.

Ms. Berkley stated that the legislative session will start on Monday, February 2, 2015. She noted that she will review all bills to determine if they are in any way remotely related to physical therapy. She stated if there is, the bill goes to the Board's director to review. She stated she relies on the director to determine if the bill needs to be tracked, or if immediate action is necessary. She noted that if immediate action is necessary, the director will work with her to draft testimony. The director noted that she will seek assistance from the Board on all practice related bills, and will consult with legal counsel as necessary as well. Ms. Berkley stated that she is communicating with the association lobbyist to make sure all is covered. She noted that public protection is the Board's role and that is her focus. Ms. Berkley noted that there are a lot of new people in the legislature this session, and many have not chaired meetings. Member Smith asked about the Occupational Therapy Board bill regarding telemedicine. Ms. Berkley noted that she represents the OT Board as well and she hopes Senator Harding will kill the bill, as there is a bill covering all healthcare Boards and that language is more detailed and sophisticated. She noted the OT Board bill is only a back-up if the major bill dies. On the senate side things will run smoother as they have been there longer. Richard Dreitzer mentioned AB53, which pertains to disciplining of licensees. It was noted that bill allows a licensee to surrender their license. Richard Dreitzer asked if the Chiropractic Board had any bills of concern to the Board. Ms. Berkley noted there were no bills of concern.

- Item 15- Review and approval of financial audit for fiscal years ending June 2013 and June 2014. Lisa Jones, the Board's accountant, reported on this item. Ms. Jones noted that the Board elected to have their audit every two years. She stated there is a clean opinion on the audit statement. She noted the Board remained healthy from a financial standpoint. She noted that there are required findings related to internal control that become a challenge for Boards will small staff. She noted the

Board has a bookkeeper. She noted there is no staff with knowledge to review the financials, which is typical for Boards. She noted that someone who is an accountant or has an accounting background would need to review the audit financials and report to the Board to avoid the findings. She noted it would cost the Board approximately \$1,000 for the review. The director noted that the finding has been present in all audits and the state has not had a concern as the numbers are good and they are aware we are a small Board. The accountant stated she has no concerns, that the Board is not doing anything wrong. She said the Board has nothing to be concerned with. Chairman Puentedura noted that one year's notes show a decrease in expenditures and lists the lobbyist, and the next finding shows an increase in expenditures and lists the lobbyist. Ms. Jones noted that the Board's expenses are cyclical. She noted there is appropriate cash on hand, and there are no swings in the numbers to be concerned with. She noted there was an increase in legal fees, but that is a necessary thing for Boards.

Item 16- Review of the Federation of State Board of Physical Therapy 2015 National Physical Therapy Examination Policies. It was noted that effective January 2016, there will be a 6 lifetime maximum on taking the test. Additionally, the FSBPT will limit on scores of less than 400. Chairman Puentedura noted there is a very small percentage who don't pass on the third and fourth attempt. He noted the test was designed to measure minimally entry level competence. He noted that the FSBPT has strong exam security in place. Chairman Puentedura also noted that writing exam items is quite an experience. It was noted that a lot of problems will be resolved when the lifetime limit is instituted as it will take it out of the Board's hands.

Item 17- Review of the Federation of State Board of Physical Therapy 2015 budget. Chairman Puentedura noted the FSBPT has a lot of money, and they are a well-run company. Member Menicucci stated it was a simple budget and the FSBPT is very solvent.

Item 32- Items for future agendas. Richard Dreitzer stated that the Oriental Medicine Board contacted him and they have indicated they will request an appearance before the Board regarding the PT Board opinion regarding dry needling.
