# NOTICE OF INTENT TO ACT UPON A REGULATION

### Notice of Hearing for the Adoption of proposed Regulations of the Nevada Physical Therapy Board and the Nevada State Board of Athletic Trainers

The Nevada Physical Therapy Board and the Nevada State Board of Athletic Trainers will hold a public hearing November 15, 2019 at 2:00 pm. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of regulations pertaining to Chapter 640 & 640B of the Nevada Administrative Code.

The following information is provided pursuant to the requirements of NRS 233B.0603:

1) What is the need for and purpose of the proposed regulation or amendment?

The regulation is necessary to comply with the provisions of Senate Bill (SB) 186 of the 2019 Legislative Session. SB186 added Dry Needling to the Practice Act of physical therapists and athletic trainers. The purpose of the regulation is to adopt regulations establishing the qualifications a physical therapist or athletic trainer must obtain before he or she is authorized to perform dry needling.

2) What are the terms of substance of the proposed regulation?

The proposed regulations will revise Chapter 640 and Chapter 640B of the Nevada Administrative Code, providing provisions for the following:

- a. Qualifications a physical therapist or athletic trainer must obtain before he or she is authorized to perform dry needling.
- b. Procedures concerning the handling of needles used to perform dry needling.
- c. Procedures to ensure that a physical therapist or athletic trainer does not engage in needle retention.
- 3) What is the estimated economic effect of the regulation on the business which it is to regulate and on the public?
  - a. Physical Therapists
    - i. Physical therapist who are approved to practice dry needling may have more

opportunities in the public market.

- b. Public
  - i. Consumers who wish to receive dry needling treatment from physical therapists may have a larger marketplace from which to select services.
- 4) What is the anticipated adverse impact, if any?
  - a. Physical Therapists
    - i. No adverse impact is anticipated by this regulation.
  - b. Public
    - i. No adverse impact is anticipated by this regulation.
- 5) Do other regulations address the same problem(s)?

6) Are alternate forms of regulation sufficient to address the problem(s)?

7) What value does the regulation have to the public?

The regulation provides standards of care and training and education qualification for the delivery of dry needling skilled intervention, to help maintain the highest standards for public safety.

8) What is the anticipated cost of the regulation, both direct and indirect?

The Board anticipates no additional costs, either directly or indirectly.

9) Does the regulation establish a new fee or increase an existing fee?

The regulation does not establish a new fee or increase an existing fee.

10) Provide a statement which identifies the methods used by the agency in determining the impact of the proposed regulation on a small business, prepared pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 233B.0608.

During the multi-year process of establishing regulatory provisions for the education and training of physical therapists practicing dry needling, the Board solicited and considered input in determining educational and training requirements, economic impacts, and benefits to the public. The Board also conducted surveys of licensed physical therapist. Further, the Board created an Advisory Committee comprised of representatives of the oriental medicine community, the nursing community and the physical therapy community. Copies of meeting agendas, meeting minutes, proposed regulations, notices of workshop and notices of intent to act were posted and provided to persons who were known to have an interest in the subject. These documents were also made available pursuant to the provisions of chapters 233B and 241 of Nevada Revised Statutes.

11) Provide a description of any regulations of other state or local governmental agencies which the proposed regulation overlaps or duplicates, and a statement explaining why the duplication or overlapping is necessary. If the regulation overlaps or duplicates a federal regulation, state the name of the regulating federal agency.

There are no other local, state or federal regulations that overlap or duplicate the regulation. SB186 required the State Board of Athletic Trainers to also adopt regulations establishing the qualifications an athletic trainer must obtain before he or she is authorized to perform dry needling. The Nevada Physical Therapy Board and the State Board of Athletic Trainers collaborated on proposed regulations to revise Chapter 640 and Chapter 640B of the Nevada Administrative Code, satisfying both Board's requirements under SB186.

12) If the regulation is required pursuant to federal law, provide a citation and description of the federal law.

The regulation is not required pursuant to federal law.

13) If the regulation includes provisions which are more stringent than a federal regulation that regulates the same activity, provide a summary of such provisions.

There are no federal regulations that address the requirements in the regulation.
