# ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CONTINUING COMPETENCE MEETING MINUTES JUNE 4, 2021

**Item 1 -** Call to order / Roll call for Confirmation of Quorum.

### **Item 2 -** Public Comments

Kimberly Prucha, Fulcrum Institute – I provided comments on the letter that has been forwarded to the Advisory Committee requesting an appeal of courses that were denied in the last meeting. I hope that the documentation for the Cranial 1 Mobilization courses will be reconsidered. One of the key points as to why the courses were denied was that scientific evidence has clearly invalidated the topic, and that's not the case. There are differing pieces but it has not completely and clearly invalidated cranial as an effective technique for work. That is seen not only in some examples within the letter that I wrote, but also in 2.5 reference pages that were submitted with the application back in April. I'm hoping that the Board will reconsider this course and approve it. I guess one of the questions that I have is, if the course is allowed to take place and we are allowed to use this work, then I guess we will just need a better understanding as to why it can't be

given CEU approval, and have all therapists across the spectrum of which we practice be supported within the State of Nevada.

Member Tulimero introduced herself and provided a short bio.

**Item 4 -** Staff Update and Discussion on Possible Approval of Additional ACCC Meeting Dates (For Possible Action)

Staff discussed changes to the course application review process and advised the Advisory Committee that the bulk of applications are received between May and July, which accounts for the large number of courses being reviewed today. Due to the volume of course application submissions, an additional meeting may be needed. Staff will coordinate the next meeting date.

**Item 6 -** Request for Approval of Face to Face Continuing Education provided by the American College of Healthcare Executives.

Chair Barrett - The Board received a letter from Sheri Silverman asking for approval of courses from the American College of Healthcare Executives, however, there were no courses attached for review. The ACCC can not give blanket approval for one provider. Request that staff notify the requestor and inform her that for courses to be approved they have to submit through the formal process for review and discussion.

**Item 7 -** Course Appeal Requests. (For Possible Action).

A. Genesis Healthcare

Chair Barrett - The ACCC requested a quiz from this provider at the last meeting. The provider did not attach a quiz with their appeal request, so why is this being reviewed by the ACCC. Member Nash stated that there seemed to be a misunderstanding from the provider between virtual and live, so the provider did not feel that they needed a post-test. Chelsea Wilson relayed her conversation with the applicant, who mentioned that there was no specific

clarification between how they were categorizing their course, and the ACCC White Paper. The provider felt that the Committee's decision was unfair, and requested an appeal, therefore it was brought back before the ACCC for further discussion and clarification. Chair Barrett stated that even if the course is live like a webinar, there is no way to ensure that the person on the other end actually participates and pays attention. This is why we have always asked for a quiz. If the course is not in person, regardless of it being virtual, it needs to have a post-test.

Genesis Healthcare will be notified that their request for appeal is denied, however, the Advisory Committee's original request to add a quiz still applies. If they want to make a quiz and send it in, it will be reviewed.

#### B. Fulcrum Institute

Chair Barrett - An appeal letter was provided by Kimberly Fulcrum, the public member who also gave public comment regarding the course on cranial physical therapy. Chair Barrett asked for the Committee's thoughts based upon the appeal letter and the ACCC's original position to deny the course based on the White Paper denial code C1G, which covers a valid practice that is not accepted by contemporary practicing physical therapist, and also denial code C1, about issues related to an area of clinical practice which the scientific evidence has clearly invalidated the topic.

Member Nash – I'd just like to mention that I've looked in our textbooks and don't see the technique. Is there any published peer review research that they were able to provide to you, demonstrating the actual movement or efficacy of this treatment?

Chair Barrett – There was some evidence provided last time from Kimberly, and that evidence was not strong enough to support what the course was actually teaching. So there wasn't any evidence that was strong enough to support it. I do want to make a note about one thing that was stated in the letter regarding the specialist certification exam for neurologic physical therapy. When I responded to Kimberly and stated that there wasn't craniosacral included in the exam, I wasn't saying that we need to teach to the exam. I was just using that as an example for the fact that it wasn't a technique that is done by contemporarily practicing physical

therapy because if it was, then it would be something that is included in the neurologic specialty for physical therapy, and it's not currently included in that. So I wasn't saying that they needed to take it, I was just using that as an example of the fact that this is something that physical therapists in the neurologic realm use.

Member Nash – I understood it that way as well. As a neurological clinical specialist, I am not familiar with the technique. I have never utilized the technique, I should say, and without current evidence demonstrating the efficacy and the need that physical therapists should have to learn this information, I still stand with my original thoughts.

Member Luthy - I'm not a neuro specialist, so I'm not all that familiar with the practice itself. However, I am a big proponent of current research and I feel that if we don't have substantial research to support the teachings that they are providing, then I would agree to stand by our initial denial.

Member Boyd – I'm glad you clarified the example that you used about it not being something that is needed for studying and taking the NPCS. I'm not NCS. If there were current ongoing research that supports it then I would support it, but at this time I have not changed my mind on the position either.
