NEVADA JOINS THE PT COMPACT

The Nevada Physical Therapy Board is proud to announce that Nevada has officially joined the Physical Therapy Compact (PT Compact), a major step forward in expanding practice mobility and improving patient access to care across state lines. Once fully implemented, eligible physical therapists (PTs) and physical therapist assistants (PTAs) will be able to obtain Compact Privileges, granting the ability to practice in other participating states without securing individual licenses in each one.

This milestone expands practice mobility, strengthens telehealth, and helps us meet the needs of underserved and rural communities. It also gives Nevada's healthcare system a powerful new tool to address workforce shortages while ensuring continuity of care.



Expanding Opportunities Across State Lines!

The Physical Therapy Compact (PT Compact) is a collaborative agreement between multiple U.S. states that allows PTs and PTAs to practice in any participating state without the need to obtain a separate license for each state.

This agreement is overseen by the Physical Therapy Compact Commission, which is made up of representatives from all member states who work together to ensure the Compact operates smoothly and efficiently.

The Compact offers a more streamlined, cost-effective way for PTs and PTAs to expand their practice across state lines. Instead of applying for traditional licenses in each state—a process that can be time-consuming and expensive—licensed professionals can purchase "Compact Privileges," granting them the ability to practice in multiple states quickly and legally. This approach not only saves time and money, but also increases access to physical therapy services for patients in different regions.

PT COMPACT: WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

To be eligible to obtain a Compact Privilege through Nevada, an applicant must:

- Hold an active, unencumbered Nevada PT or PTA license.
 Nevada must be the applicant's primary state of residence.
- Have no encumbrances or disciplinary actions on any license for at least two years.
- 3. Not have any adverse actions against any license or Compact Privilege in the last two years.
- Have completed all requirements from any prior adverse actions.
- 5. Successfully pass the Nevada Jurisprudence Exam (NV JAM).
- Notify the PT Compact Commission of their intent to seek Compact Privileges in specific remote states.

What The PT Compact Means for NV licensees and Patients

Instead of applying for and maintaining licensure in every state where they want to work, eligible practitioners can purchase a Compact Privilege, which grants the legal right to practice in other compact member states — provided they meet certain requirements

By joining the PT Compact, Nevada:

Expands Access: Patients in Nevada can more easily receive care from out-of-state PTs and PTAs, particularly in border areas or through telehealth.

Interstate Practice Boosts Mobility: PTs and PTAs can practice in any participating state as long as they hold a valid license in their home state, which must also be a member of the Compact. This creates more job opportunities and flexibility.

Reduces Red Tape: Streamlined licensure processes mean less time on paperwork, less administrative costs, and more time with patients.

Responds to Emergencies: In times of crisis, such as natural disasters or public health emergencies, states can respond faster with a more mobile workforce.

Implementation Date Announcement Coming Soon

We are excited to advance this initiative, which will significantly enhance licensure mobility for PTs and PTAs in Nevada.

Although Assembly Bill 248 (AB248) took effect on July 1, 2025, the issuance of Physical Therapy Compact licenses for Nevada is not yet live.

The NVPTB is completing programmatic changes to ensure the accurate tracking of

Compact Privileges and the secure exchange of licensee information.

We greatly appreciate your patience as we work through the final stages of implementation.

The official implementation date will be announced in the near future.

We'll continue to keep you updated as the transition moves forward, including clear instructions on how to obtain a PT Compact Privilege.

A MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR

This year marks a significant milestone for the Nevada Physical Therapy Board. In July, representatives of the NVPTB and APTA Nevada had the honor of joining Governor Joe Lombardo for the signing of two important measures: Assembly Bill 248, authorizing Nevada to join the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact, and Senate Bill 113, expanding the role of physical therapists to certify disability status for parking privileges.



The Board and staff are now deeply engaged in the programming and administrative work needed to fully implement the PT Compact in Nevada. This includes coordinating with the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) and aligning our licensing systems to allow seamless participation for Nevada physical therapists and for licensees from other compact member states. Our goal is to ensure a smooth and efficient rollout that expands mobility for practitioners while maintaining the highest standards of public protection.

In addition to these legislative advancements, the Board continues to focus on long-term priorities. At our recent strategic planning meeting, we outlined efforts to begin the administrative review of Chapter 640 of the Nevada Administrative Code, a critical step in ensuring our regulations remain current, effective, and aligned with our mission to protect the public.



I want to take a moment to recognize the dedication of our Board members and staff. Under the leadership of Executive Director Harvey, the Board's work has been honored nationally.

Director Harvey has been named a 2025 recipient of the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) Outstanding Service Award, acknowledging his exceptional contributions over the past year.

In addition, the Board has been selected to receive the FSBPT Excellence in Regulation Award, which recognizes jurisdictions that have advanced public protection for consumers of physical therapy services.

These honors reflect not only individual leadership but also the collective hard work, collaboration, and commitment of everyone involved with the NVPTB. I am proud of what we have accomplished together and look forward to building on this momentum in the year ahead.





This summer, the Nevada Physical Therapy Board convened for a comprehensive strategic planning session to establish the Board's direction and priorities through 2030. The planning session focused on ensuring that the Board continues to meet its mission of protecting the public, supporting physical therapy professionals, and strengthening access to safe, effective care throughout the state.

The Board's discussions centered on enhancing both internal operations and external engagement to address the evolving needs of Nevada's physical therapy community and the public we serve. The outcome of these discussions is a strategic framework built around four key goals.

Strategic Goals

Goal 1: Public Protection

The Board reaffirmed its primary mission of safeguarding the health, safety, and welfare of the public. This includes maintaining high standards for licensure, enforcing professional conduct, and ensuring accountability in physical therapy practice.

Goal 2: Update Rules and Regulation Safety

To keep pace with changes in healthcare, technology, and professional standards, the Board will review and update its current rules and regulations. This effort will prioritize clarity, relevance, and enforceability, ensuring that the regulatory framework continues to support safe, ethical, and effective care.

Goal 3: Improve Member Training and Competency

Effective governance begins with informed and prepared Board members. The strategic plan includes enhanced onboarding, mentorship, ongoing education, and professional development to strengthen Board decision-making and oversight capacity.

Goal 4: Increase Availability of Care

Recognizing barriers to access across Nevada, the Board will explore policy and regulatory initiatives that support greater availability of physical therapy services, especially in underserved and rural areas, without compromising quality or safety.



With this plan, the NVPTB reaffirms its commitment to being a proactive, transparent, and accountable regulatory body. These strategic goals position the Board to meet the challenges of a dynamic healthcare environment while continuing to uphold the highest standards of professional practice in physical therapy.

As we move into the final months of the year, our focus remains firmly on professional standards, public trust and future readiness. The Physical Therapy Compact stands as a



LICENSE RENEWAL

Helpful Tips for a Smooth Process



Stay Active, Stay Compliant

Licenses issued by the Nevada Physical Therapy Board are valid for one year, and it is the responsibility of each licensee to ensure that their license remains active. Under NRS 640.640, it is unlawful to practice or offer to practice physical therapy without a valid license, and doing so with an expired license constitutes a misdemeanor offense.

To support licensees, the NVPTB provides a clear roadmap to help you complete renewal smoothly and on time. Please also ensure the Board has your current contact information, including an up-to-date email address, as renewal reminders are automatically generated 60 days, 30 days, and 5 days prior to your license expiration date. If your license is not renewed within the licensure period, an official license expiration notice will be issued.

Below are key reminders and helpful tips for renewing your Nevada Physical Therapy license.

01

Complete Your Continuing Competence Hours

 Every licensee must complete 15 hours of continuing competence (CCUs) within their renewal period.

02

Upload CCUs into CE Broker

 Enter your CEU information and upload supporting course certificates into your CE Broker account.

03

Renew You License via the Licensee Portal

- Log in to the NVPTB Licensee Portal
- Complete the license renewal application, which includes a 20-question jurisprudence exam.
- Submit the license renewal fee.

New Requirements (1/1/2025)

- All licensees are required to pass an annual jurisprudence examination as part of their license renewal.
- At least 1 of the required 15 CCUs must cover Cultural Awareness, Access, or Ethical Standards within the year before license expiration.
- Topics include: Ethics, Access, Bias, Gender/Sexuality, Culture, Race, Spiritual Beliefs, Ageism, ICF bias, and employer provided Cultural Competency (DEI) courses. Upload the CCU under CE Broker's "Diversity, Equity, Inclusion or Social Justice" tab.

DID YOU KNOW?

The NVPTB follows two license renewal schedules.

- Licenses issued before October 2017: Expire annually on July 31st.
- 2. Licenses issued after October 2017: Expire one year from the date of issuance.

Approximately 65% of NV licenses expire between May-July each year, making it the Board's bulk renewal period.

DO YOU KNOW OUR PUBLIC MEMBER: ANITA WAGNER

One of the unique strengths of the Nevada Physical Therapy Board is its composition. While the majority of members are licensed physical therapists and a physical therapist assistant, the Board also includes a public member, someone who does not practice physical therapy but represents the perspective of Nevada's citizens.

Having a public member on the Board ensures that decision-making is not only informed by professional expertise, but also guided by the experiences and expectations of the community we serve. Public members bring balance, transparency, and accountability, reminding us that the practice of physical therapy ultimately exists to protect and benefit patients.

Why Public Members Are Important

Public members play a vital role in:

- Consumer Protection: They advocate for patients' rights and ensure the public interest is central to Board actions.
- Transparency and Trust: Their presence reinforces that licensing decisions are not made solely by professionals, but with input from those outside the profession.
- Fresh Perspective: They often raise questions and concerns professionals may overlook, keeping discussions grounded in real-world expectations of customer service, communication, and patient care.

On November 1, 2024, Anita Wagner was appointed as the Public Member of the Nevada Physical Therapy Board, bringing a wealth of experience as both an advocate and a parent. She has long been involved with the Nevada Dual Sensory Impairment Project in Reno, serving as a parent and advisory committee member. Her dedication was recognized in 2008 when she received the Family Advocate Award from the Nevada Disability and Advocacy Law Center. That same year, she completed Nevada Partners in Policymaking training, further strengthening her advocacy skills.

Professionally, Anita worked in multiple roles with the Clark County School District, including sign language assistant, braille transcriber/assistant, clerical support, administrative assistant, and banking. Her background demonstrates a consistent commitment to communication, service, and accessibility.

A Voice for Patients

- Anita has a deep, personal understanding of the importance of advocacy and support in healthcare. She is especially passionate about ensuring:
 - Customer Service: Patients and families are treated with dignity, respect, and compassion at every step of their care.
 - Professionalism: Physical therapists uphold the highest standards of conduct, fostering trust in the patient-provider relationship.
 - Informed Consent: Patients and families fully understand their care plans, empowering them to make informed decisions about their treatment.

Anita's presence on the Board reinforces that physical therapy is not only about clinical skill, but also about people, compassion, and trust. She ensures the patient's voice remains at the heart of our decisions, and we deeply value the perspective and insight she contributes to our mission.



Administrative Actions

Disciplinary Actions Update

Jan - Aug 2025

The Nevada Physical Therapy Board is responsible for protecting the public by regulating the practice of physical therapy in accordance with Nevada law. When licensees fail to uphold the standards outline in the Practice Act, the Board takes corrective action to reinforce accountability and safeguard patients.

Below is a summary of disciplinary actions taken in 2025, with explanatory notes to help the reader understand the types of violations addressed. The Board shares these disciplinary summaries to emphasize our collective responsibility to uphold the standards that protect the people of Nevada. These cases remind us that accountability is critical to maintaining the trust placed in this profession.

NEW CONSUMER NOTIFICATION

The Nevada Physical Therapy Board is committed to protecting the public and ensuring the safe and ethical practice of physical therapy. In accordance with NRS 640.161, the Board is authorized to receive, investigate, and resolve consumer complaints regarding licensees. The Board takes all complaints seriously and strives to handle each matter with fairness, confidentiality, and timeliness, while upholding its responsibility to safeguard patient care and the integrity of the profession.

In addition to enforcing disciplinary actions, the Board is introducing a new consumer notification that informs patients of their rights and explains the NVPTB's role in regulating the profession. We are asking licensees to voluntarily posts this notification at their place of employment. Doing so ensures that patients are aware of their rights and builds transparency with the communities we serve.

How to File a Complaint

What to Include in a Complaint

- Date and location of incident
- Name of the PT or PTA involved
- · Names of any witnesses
- Brief narrative of incident/concern



Licensed To Serve You

In the State of Nevada, Physical Therapists (PTs) and Physical Therapist Assistants (PTAs) are licensed and regulated by the Nevada Physical Therapy Board (NVPTB).

Note: Physical Therapy Technicians (also called Aides) are not licensed healthcare providers and are not regulated.

Your Right as a Patient

- You have the right to receive care from a licensed provider.
- You may verify a provider's license or file a complaint regarding care or professional conduct.
- You have the right to be informed about your treatment and to participate in treatment decisions.

Do You Have a Patient Safety Concern or Complaint?

If you're concerned about the care you received from a PT or PTA, you have options:

- Talk to your provider. Open communication can resolve many issues.
- Speak to a clinic manager or administrator. Escalate your concern within the facility.
- File a formal complaint with the NVPTB.
